Biliteracy Program. (BDR 34-526)

AN ACT relating to education; providing for the establishment of
the State Seal of Biliteracy Program to recognize pupils
who have attained a high level of proficiency in one or
more languages in addition to English; and providing
other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 **Section 2** of this bill provides for the establishment of the State Seal of
2 Biliteracy Program to recognize pupils who have attained a high level of
3 proficiency in one or more languages in addition to English by affixing the State
4 Seal of Biliteracy to the diploma of each pupil who meets certain requirements.
5 **Section 3** of this bill prescribes the requirements that a pupil must meet in order to
6 be awarded the State Seal of Biliteracy.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 388 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

3 **Sec. 2. 1. *The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall***
4 ***establish a State Seal of Biliteracy Program to recognize pupils***
5 ***who graduate from a public high school, including, without***



1 *limitation, a charter school and a university school for profoundly*
2 *gifted pupils, who have attained a high level of proficiency in one*
3 *or more languages in addition to English.*

4 *2. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall:*

5 *(a) Create a State Seal of Biliteracy that may be affixed to the*
6 *diploma of a pupil to recognize that the pupil has met the*
7 *requirements of section 3 of this act; and*

8 *(b) Deliver the State Seal of Biliteracy to each school district*
9 *that participates in the program.*

10 *3. Any school district, charter school and university school*
11 *for profoundly gifted pupils may participate in the State Seal of*
12 *Biliteracy Program by notifying the Superintendent of Public*
13 *Instruction of its intent to participate in the Program.*

14 *4. Each board of trustees of a school district and governing*
15 *body of a charter school or university school for profoundly gifted*
16 *pupils that participates in the State Seal of Biliteracy Program*
17 *shall:*

18 *(a) Identify the pupils who have met the requirements to be*
19 *awarded the State Seal of Biliteracy; and*

20 *(b) Affix the State Seal of Biliteracy to the diploma of each*
21 *pupil who meets those requirements.*

22 *5. The Superintendent of Public Instruction may adopt*
23 *regulations as necessary to carry out the provisions of this section*
24 *and section 3 of this act.*

25 **Sec. 3.** *A school district, charter school and university school*
26 *for profoundly gifted pupils that participates in the State Seal of*
27 *Biliteracy Program established pursuant to section 2 of this act*
28 *must award a pupil, upon graduation from high school, a high*
29 *school diploma with a State Seal of Biliteracy if the pupil:*

30 *1. Successfully completes all courses of study in English*
31 *language arts that are required for graduation with at least a 2.0*
32 *grade point average, on a 4.0 grading scale;*

33 *2. Demonstrates proficiency in one or more languages other*
34 *than English:*

35 *(a) By passing an advanced placement examination in a world*
36 *language with a score of 3 or higher or passing an international*
37 *baccalaureate examination in a world language with a score of 4*
38 *or higher; or*

39 *(b) Through successful completion of at least 4 years of*
40 *courses in a world language with at least a 3.0 grade point*
41 *average, on a 4.0 grading scale, in those courses; and*

42 *3. If the primary language of the pupil is not English,*
43 *demonstrates proficiency in English on an assessment designated*
44 *by the Department.*
