AN ACT relating to unlawful acts; prohibiting a person from obstructing certain property or roadways; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 This bill: (1) prohibits a person from intentionally obstructing certain property or
2 roadways; and (2) prescribes certain civil remedies for persons aggrieved by such conduct.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 41 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
2 section to read as follows:

3 *1. A person shall not intentionally obstruct:*

4 *(a) The ingress or egress to any public or private property from any other*
5 *public or private place in such a manner as not to leave a free passageway for*
6 *persons and vehicles lawfully seeking to enter or leave the property via the public*
7 *or private place; or*

8 *(b) Any public or private roadway, including, without limitation,*
9 *intersections, so as to prevent the safe passage of vehicles thereon or*
10 *therethrough.*

11 *2. In addition to any other remedy, a person aggrieved by a violation of*
12 *subsection 1 may bring a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction against*
13 *any person who commits the violation to seek any or all of the following relief:*

14 *(a) Declaratory and injunctive relief, including, without limitation, injunctive*
15 *relief to enjoin any ongoing activity that violates any provision of subsection 1.*
16 *For the purposes of injunctive relief, a person who brings an action pursuant to*
17 *this subsection is entitled to a rebuttable presumption of irreparable harm.*

18 *(b) Actual damages.*

- 1 *(c) Reasonable attorney's fees and costs.*
2 *(d) Any other legal or equitable relief that the court deems appropriate.*
3 *3. A person who violates the provisions of this section is not subject to*
4 *criminal liability.*
5 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
