INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

Assembly Bill No. 185—AN ACT relating to product liability; prohibiting certain actions against a seller of a product who is not the manufacturer of the product; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assembly Bill No. 186—AN ACT relating to craft distilleries; increasing the quantity of spirits a craft distillery may export to another state; allowing a craft distillery to serve samples of and sell its spirits at one other location in addition to the craft distillery; increasing the quantity of spirits that a craft distillery may sell at retail for consumption off the premises; allowing a craft distillery to donate and transport spirits for charitable or nonprofit purposes under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.
