

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 413—COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

MARCH 27, 2017

Referred to Committee on Judiciary

SUMMARY—Makes various changes relating to electronic documents and electronic signatures. (BDR 12-597)

EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets ~~omitted material~~ is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to electronic documents; establishing provisions relating to electronic wills and trusts; revising provisions governing electronic notaries public; authorizing electronic notaries public to perform authorized electronic notarial acts remotely using audio-video communication; increasing the amount of the fees authorized to be charged by an electronic notary public for the performance of certain electronic notarial acts and authorizing the collection of a fee to recover certain costs; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 Existing law establishes provisions relating to electronic wills. (NRS 132.119,
2 133.085, 136.185) **Sections 10-17** of this bill establish various other provisions
3 relating to electronic wills. **Sections 8 and 19** of this bill revise the description of
4 an electronic will and **section 10** establishes the circumstances in which an
5 electronic will is self-proving. **Sections 11 and 12** establish the qualifications and
6 duties of a qualified custodian of an electronic will, who is required to store an
7 electronic record containing an electronic will in accordance with a system for
8 ensuring the safekeeping of electronic records. **Sections 13 and 14** set forth the
9 circumstances in which a qualified custodian is authorized to cease serving in such
10 a capacity. **Section 15** establishes provisions concerning affidavits by a qualified
11 custodian who creates a certified paper original of an electronic will, which **section**
12 **3** of this bill generally defines as a tangible document containing the text of an
13 electronic will. **Section 16** sets forth provisions relating to the ability of an
14 electronic notary public or other notarial officer to perform certain notarial acts.
15 **Section 17** establishes various provisions for purposes relating to the execution and
16 filing of any document with a court in any proceeding relating to an electronic will
17 and for certain other purposes.



18 **Section 18** of this bill establishes requirements relating to a declaration or
19 affidavit of a witness to an electronic will. **Section 20** of this bill provides the
20 methods by which an electronic will may be revoked. **Section 21** of this bill sets
21 forth provisions relating to the jurisdiction in which an electronic will may be
22 proved and the admittance of a certified paper original of an electronic will to
23 probate.

24 **Sections 23-28** of this bill revise provisions relating to trusts. **Section 24**
25 provides that a video recording or other electronic record may be admissible in
26 court as evidence of certain issues relating to a trust, and **section 28** revises the
27 description of an electronic trust.

28 Existing law establishes the Electronic Notary Public Authorization Act
29 pursuant to which an electronic notary public appointed by the Secretary of State is
30 authorized to perform electronic notarial acts. (NRS 240.181-240.206) **Section 39**
31 of this bill renames the act as the Remote Notarization Enabling Act and **section 45**
32 of this bill requires electronic notaries public to register with, instead of be
33 appointed by, the Secretary of State. **Section 35** of this bill: (1) authorizes an
34 electronic notary public to perform authorized electronic notarial acts remotely
35 using audio-video communication, which **section 30** of this bill defines as
36 communication by which a person is able to see, hear and communicate with
37 another person in real time using electronic means; and (2) sets forth certain
38 requirements relating to such electronic notarial acts. **Section 36** of this bill
39 generally provides that an authorized electronic notarial act performed using audio-
40 video communication shall be deemed to have been performed in this State and
41 must be governed by the laws of this State, regardless of whether the person for
42 whom the act is performed is physically located in another jurisdiction.

43 **Section 37** of this bill requires an electronic notary public to arrange for a
44 recording to be made of each electronic notarial act performed using audio-video
45 communication and to give all participating persons advance notice of the
46 recording. **Section 37** also requires the recording to be kept for not less than 5
47 years. **Section 51** of this bill requires an electronic notary public to keep an
48 electronic journal of each notarial act which he or she performs and to maintain and
49 protect the electronic journal at all times.

50 **Section 38** of this bill establishes provisions relating to the confirmation of the
51 identity of a person for whom an electronic notarial act is performed using audio-
52 video communication. **Section 50** of this bill requires an electronic notary public to
53 render an electronic document that is the subject of an electronic notarial act
54 tamper-evident.

55 **Section 48** of this bill increases the amount of fees which an electronic notary
56 public may charge for performing certain electronic notarial acts and authorizes an
57 electronic notary public to charge a reasonable fee to recover any cost of providing
58 a copy of an entry or a recording of an audio-video communication in the electronic
59 journal maintained by the electronic notary public.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 132 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 5, inclusive, of this
3 act.

4 **Sec. 2.** *Except as otherwise specifically provided in this title,*
5 *the provisions of this title must be construed in a manner*
6 *consistent with the provisions of chapter 719 of NRS.*



1 **Sec. 3.** *“Certified paper original” means a tangible*
2 *document that contains the text of an electronic will and, if*
3 *applicable, a self-proving affidavit concerning the electronic will.*

4 **Sec. 4.** *“Electronic notary public” has the meaning ascribed*
5 *to it in NRS 240.186.*

6 **Sec. 5.** *“Qualified custodian” means a person who meets the*
7 *requirements of section 11 of this act.*

8 **Sec. 6.** NRS 132.025 is hereby amended to read as follows:
9 132.025 As used in this title, unless the context otherwise
10 requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 132.030 to 132.370,
11 inclusive, *and sections 3, 4 and 5 of this act* have the meanings
12 ascribed to them in those sections.

13 **Sec. 7.** NRS 132.117 is hereby amended to read as follows:
14 132.117 “Electronic record” means a record created, generated
15 *, sent, communicated, received* or stored by electronic means.

16 **Sec. 8.** NRS 132.119 is hereby amended to read as follows:
17 132.119 “Electronic will” means ~~fa testamentary document that~~
18 ~~complies~~ *an instrument, including, without limitation, a codicil,*
19 *that is executed by a person in accordance* with the requirements of
20 NRS 133.085 ~~H~~ *and which disposes of the property of the person*
21 *upon or after his or her death.*

22 **Sec. 9.** Chapter 133 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
23 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 10 to 17, inclusive, of this
24 act.

25 **Sec. 10. 1.** *An electronic will is self-proving if:*
26 (a) *The declarations or affidavits of the attesting witnesses are*
27 *incorporated as part of, attached to or logically associated with the*
28 *electronic will, as described in NRS 133.050;*

29 (b) *The electronic will designates a qualified custodian to*
30 *maintain custody of the electronic record of the electronic will;*
31 *and*

32 (c) *Before being admitted to probate or being reduced to a*
33 *certified paper original that is admitted to probate, the electronic*
34 *will was at all times under the custody of a qualified custodian.*

35 2. *A declaration or affidavit of an attesting witness made*
36 *pursuant to NRS 133.050 and an affidavit of a qualified custodian*
37 *made pursuant to section 15 of this act must be accepted by a*
38 *court as if made before the court.*

39 **Sec. 11.** *A qualified custodian of an electronic will:*
40 1. *Must not be an heir of the testator or a beneficiary or*
41 *devisee under the electronic will.*

42 2. *Shall consistently employ a system for ensuring the*
43 *safekeeping of electronic records and store electronic records*
44 *containing electronic wills in accordance with such a system.*



1 3. *Shall store in the electronic record of an electronic will*
2 *each of the following:*

3 (a) *A photograph or other visual record of the testator and the*
4 *attesting witnesses that was taken contemporaneously with the*
5 *execution of the electronic will;*

6 (b) *A photocopy, photograph, facsimile or other visual record*
7 *of any documentation that was taken contemporaneously with the*
8 *execution of the electronic will and provides satisfactory evidence*
9 *of the identities of the testator and the attesting witnesses,*
10 *including, without limitation, documentation of the methods of*
11 *identification used pursuant to subsection 4 of NRS 240.1655; and*

12 (c) *An audio and video recording of the testator, attesting*
13 *witnesses and notary public, as applicable, performing the actions*
14 *described in paragraph (b) of subsection 1 of NRS 133.085.*

15 4. *Shall provide to any court that is hearing a matter*
16 *involving an electronic will which is currently or was previously*
17 *stored by the qualified custodian any information requested by the*
18 *court pertaining to the qualifications of the qualified custodian*
19 *and the policies and practices of the qualified custodian*
20 *concerning the maintenance, storage and production of electronic*
21 *wills.*

22 **Sec. 12.** *1. With regard to an electronic record of an*
23 *electronic will, a qualified custodian:*

24 (a) *Shall provide access to or information concerning the*
25 *electronic will or the certified paper original of the electronic will*
26 *only to:*

27 (1) *The testator or another person as directed by the written*
28 *instructions of the testator; and*

29 (2) *After the death of the testator, the personal*
30 *representative of the testator or any interested person; and*

31 (b) *May, in the absolute discretion of the qualified custodian,*
32 *destroy the electronic record at any time:*

33 (1) *Five or more years after the admission of any will of the*
34 *testator to probate;*

35 (2) *Five or more years after the revocation of the electronic*
36 *will;*

37 (3) *Five or more years after ceasing to serve as the*
38 *qualified custodian of the electronic record of the electronic will*
39 *pursuant to section 13 of this act;*

40 (4) *Ten or more years after the death of the testator; or*

41 (5) *One hundred and fifty years after the execution of the*
42 *electronic will.*

43 2. *At the direction of a testator in an electronic will, a*
44 *qualified custodian shall cancel, render unreadable or obliterate*
45 *the electronic record.*



1 **Sec. 13. 1. A qualified custodian may cease serving in such**
2 **a capacity by:**

3 **(a) If not designating a successor qualified custodian,**
4 **providing to the testator or, if the testator is deceased, to the**
5 **personal representative of the testator or an interested person:**

6 **(1) Thirty days' written notice that the qualified custodian**
7 **has decided to cease serving in such a capacity; and**

8 **(2) The certified paper original of, and all records**
9 **concerning, the electronic will.**

10 **(b) If designating a successor qualified custodian:**

11 **(1) Providing 30 days' written notice that the qualified**
12 **custodian has decided to cease serving in such a capacity to:**

13 **(I) The testator or, if the testator is deceased, to the**
14 **personal representative of the testator; and**

15 **(II) The designated successor qualified custodian; and**

16 **(2) Providing to the successor qualified custodian the**
17 **electronic record of the electronic will and an affidavit which**
18 **states:**

19 **(I) That the qualified custodian ceasing to act in such a**
20 **capacity is eligible to act as a qualified custodian in this State and**
21 **is the qualified custodian designated by the testator in the**
22 **electronic will or was designated to act in such a capacity by**
23 **another qualified custodian pursuant to this paragraph;**

24 **(II) That an electronic record was created at the time the**
25 **testator executed the electronic will;**

26 **(III) That the electronic record has been in the custody**
27 **of one or more qualified custodians since the execution of the**
28 **electronic will and has not been altered since the time it was**
29 **created; and**

30 **(IV) The identity of all qualified custodians who have**
31 **had custody of the electronic record since the execution of the**
32 **electronic will.**

33 **2. For purposes of making the affidavit pursuant to**
34 **subparagraph (2) of paragraph (b) of subsection 1, a qualified**
35 **custodian is entitled to rely conclusively on any affidavits provided**
36 **by a predecessor qualified custodian if all such affidavits are**
37 **provided to the successor qualified custodian.**

38 **3. Subject to the provisions of section 14 of this act, if the**
39 **testator designates a successor qualified custodian in an electronic**
40 **will, a qualified custodian shall cease serving in such a capacity**
41 **and provide to the designated successor qualified custodian:**

42 **(a) The electronic record; and**

43 **(b) The affidavit described in subparagraph (2) of paragraph**
44 **(b) of subsection 1.**



1 4. *If a qualified custodian is an entity, an affidavit of a duly*
2 *authorized officer or agent of such entity constitutes the affidavit*
3 *of the qualified custodian.*

4 **Sec. 14.** 1. *A person must execute a written statement*
5 *affirmatively agreeing to serve as the qualified custodian of an*
6 *electronic will before he or she may serve in such a capacity.*

7 2. *Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (a) of*
8 *subsection 1 of section 13 of this act, a qualified custodian may*
9 *not cease serving in such a capacity until a successor qualified*
10 *custodian executes the written statement required by subsection 1.*

11 **Sec. 15.** 1. *A qualified custodian who creates a certified*
12 *paper original shall sign an affidavit that satisfies the following*
13 *requirements:*

14 (a) *If the electronic will has always been in the custody of a*
15 *qualified custodian, the affidavit must state:*

16 (1) *That the qualified custodian is eligible to act as a*
17 *qualified custodian in this State;*

18 (2) *That the qualified custodian is the qualified custodian*
19 *designated by the testator in the electronic will or was designated*
20 *to act in such a capacity pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 1*
21 *of section 13 of this act;*

22 (3) *That an electronic record was created at the time the*
23 *testator executed the electronic will;*

24 (4) *That the electronic record has been in the custody of*
25 *one or more qualified custodians since the execution of the*
26 *electronic will, and has not been altered since the time it was*
27 *created;*

28 (5) *The identity of all qualified custodians who have had*
29 *custody of the electronic record since the execution of the*
30 *electronic will;*

31 (6) *That the certified paper original is a true, correct and*
32 *complete tangible manifestation of the electronic will; and*

33 (7) *That the records described in subsection 3 of section 11*
34 *of this act are in the custody of the qualified custodian.*

35 (b) *If the electronic will has not always been under the custody*
36 *of a qualified custodian, the person who discovered the electronic*
37 *will and the person who reduced the electronic will to the certified*
38 *paper original shall each state in an affidavit the following*
39 *information, to the best of their knowledge:*

40 (1) *When the electronic will was created, if not indicated in*
41 *the electronic will;*

42 (2) *When, how and by whom the electronic will was*
43 *discovered;*

44 (3) *The identities of each person who has had access to the*
45 *electronic will;*



1 (4) *The method in which the electronic will was stored and*
2 *the safeguards in place to prevent alterations to the electronic will;*

3 (5) *Whether the electronic will has been altered since its*
4 *execution; and*

5 (6) *That the certified paper original is a true, correct and*
6 *complete tangible manifestation of the electronic will.*

7 2. *For purposes of making an affidavit pursuant to*
8 *paragraph (a) of subsection 1, the qualified custodian may rely*
9 *conclusively on any affidavits delivered by a predecessor qualified*
10 *custodian.*

11 **Sec. 16. 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an**
12 **electronic notary public or other notarial officer may, for purposes**
13 **of this title, including, without limitation, all purposes relating to**
14 **the execution and filing of any document with the court in any**
15 **proceeding relating to an electronic will:**

16 (a) *Notarize the signature or electronic signature of a person,*
17 *as applicable, who is not in the physical presence of the electronic*
18 *notary public or other notarial officer if the person is in his or her*
19 *presence within the meaning of section 17 of this act; and*

20 (b) *Notarize any document relating to a will, codicil or*
21 *testamentary trust.*

22 2. *This section must be liberally construed and applied to*
23 *promote the purposes of NRS 133.085 and sections 10 to 17,*
24 *inclusive, of this act.*

25 **Sec. 17. 1. For purposes of this title, including, without**
26 **limitation, any declaration or affidavit made by an attesting**
27 **witnesses as described in NRS 133.050, for all purposes relating to**
28 **the execution and filing of any document with the court in any**
29 **proceeding relating to an electronic will and for purposes of**
30 **executing a power of attorney pursuant to NRS 162A.220, an**
31 **advance directive or any document relating to an advance**
32 **directive:**

33 (a) *A person shall be deemed to be in the presence of or*
34 *appearing before another person if such persons are in:*

35 (1) *The same physical location; or*

36 (2) *Different physical locations but can communicate with*
37 *each other by means of audio-video communication in accordance*
38 *with NRS 240.181 to 240.206, inclusive, and sections 30 to 38,*
39 *inclusive, of this act.*

40 (b) *An electronic notary public may electronically notarize*
41 *electronic documents, including, without limitation, documents*
42 *constituting or relating to an electronic will, NRS 240.181 to*
43 *240.206, inclusive, and sections 30 to 38, inclusive, of this act.*

44 (c) *Any requirement that a document be signed may be*
45 *satisfied by an electronic signature.*



1 (d) If a provision of law requires a written record, an
2 electronic record satisfies such a provision.

3 (e) If a document is executed electronically, the document
4 shall be deemed to be executed in this State if:

5 (1) The person executing the document states that he or she
6 understands that he or she is executing, and that he or she intends
7 to execute, the document in and pursuant to the laws of this State;

8 (2) The document states that the validity and effect of its
9 execution are governed by the laws of this State;

10 (3) Any attesting witnesses or an electronic notary public
11 whose electronic signatures are contained in the document were
12 physically located within this State at the time the document was
13 executed in accordance with this section; or

14 (4) In the case of a self-proving electronic will, the
15 electronic will designates a qualified custodian who, at the time of
16 execution:

17 (I) If a natural person, is domiciled in this State; or

18 (II) If an entity, is organized under the laws of this State
19 or whose principal place of business is located in this State.

20 2. As used in this section:

21 (a) "Advance directive" has the meaning ascribed to it in
22 NRS 449.905.

23 (b) "Audio-video communication" has the meaning ascribed to
24 it in section 30 of this act.

25 **Sec. 18.** NRS 133.050 is hereby amended to read as follows:

26 133.050 1. Any attesting witness to a will , **including,**
27 **without limitation, an electronic will,** may sign a declaration under
28 penalty of perjury or an affidavit before any person authorized to
29 administer oaths in or out of the State, stating such facts as the
30 witness would be required to testify to in court to prove the will.
31 The declaration or affidavit must be written on the will or, if that is
32 impracticable, on some paper attached thereto. **If the will is an**
33 **electronic will, the declaration or affidavit must be in a record**
34 **incorporated as part of, attached to or logically associated with the**
35 **electronic will.** The sworn statement of any witness so taken must
36 be accepted by the court as if it had been taken before the court.

37 2. The affidavit described in subsection 1 may be in

TEXT OF REPEALED SECTIONS

240.193 Requirements for bond; notification of exhaustion of penal sum; release of surety; suspension of appointment; reinstatement of appointment.

1. The bond required to be filed pursuant to NRS 240.192 must be executed by the person applying to become an electronic notary public as principal and by a surety company qualified and authorized to do business in this State. The bond must be made payable to the State of Nevada and be conditioned to provide indemnification to a person determined to have suffered damage as a result of an act by the electronic notary public which violates a provision of NRS 240.001 to 240.206, inclusive. The surety company shall pay a final, nonappealable judgment of a court of this State that has jurisdiction, upon receipt of written notice of final judgment. The bond may be continuous, but regardless of the duration of the bond, the aggregate liability of the surety does not exceed the penal sum of the bond.

2. If the penal sum of the bond is exhausted, the surety company shall notify the Secretary of State in writing within 30 days after its exhaustion.

3. The surety bond must cover the period of the appointment of the electronic notary public, except when a surety is released.

4. A surety on a bond filed pursuant to NRS 240.192 may be released after the surety gives 30 days' written notice to the Secretary of State and the electronic notary public, but the release does not discharge or otherwise affect a claim filed by a person for damage resulting from an act of the electronic notary public which is alleged to have occurred while the bond was in effect.

5. The appointment of an electronic notary public is suspended by operation of law when the electronic notary public is no longer covered by a surety bond as required by this section and NRS 240.192 or the penal sum of the bond is exhausted. If the Secretary of State receives notice pursuant to subsection 4 that the bond will be released or pursuant to subsection 2 that the penal sum of the bond is exhausted, the Secretary of State shall immediately notify the electronic notary public in writing that his or her appointment will be suspended by operation of law until another surety bond is filed in the same manner and amount as the bond being terminated.

6. The Secretary of State may reinstate the appointment of an electronic notary public whose appointment has been suspended



pursuant to subsection 5 if the electronic notary public, before his or her current term of appointment expires:

(a) Submits to the Secretary of State:

(1) An application for an amended certificate of appointment as an electronic notary public; and

(2) A certificate issued by the clerk of the county in which the applicant resides or, if the applicant is a resident of an adjoining state, the county in this State in which the applicant maintains a place of business or is employed, which indicates that the applicant filed a new surety bond with the clerk; and

(b) Pays to the Secretary of State a fee of \$10.

240.195 Courses of study required; persons required to successfully complete course of study; fees.

1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, an applicant for appointment as an electronic notary public must successfully:

(a) Complete a course of study that is in accordance with the requirements of subsection 5; and

(b) Pass an examination at the completion of the course.

2. The following persons are required to enroll in and successfully complete a course of study as required pursuant to subsection 1:

(a) A person applying for his or her first appointment as an electronic notary public;

(b) A person renewing his or her appointment as an electronic notary public; and

(c) A person who has committed a violation of this chapter or whose appointment or an electronic notary public has been suspended, and who has been required by the Secretary of State to enroll in a course of study provided pursuant to this section.

3. A course of study required to be completed pursuant to subsection 1 must:

(a) Include at least 3 hours of instruction;

(b) Provide instruction in electronic notarization, including, without limitation, notarial law and ethics, technology and procedures;

(c) Include an examination of the course content;

(d) Comply with the regulations adopted pursuant to NRS 240.206; and

(e) Be approved by the Secretary of State.

4. The Secretary of State may, with respect to a course of study required to be completed pursuant to subsection 1:

(a) Provide such a course of study; and

(b) Charge a reasonable fee to each person who enrolls in such a course of study.

5. A course of study provided pursuant to this section:



(a) Must satisfy the criteria set forth in subsection 3 and comply with the requirements set forth in the regulations adopted pursuant to NRS 240.206.

(b) May be provided in person or online by the Secretary of State or a vendor approved by the Secretary of State.

6. The Secretary of State shall deposit the fees collected pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 4 in the Notary Public Training Account created pursuant to NRS 240.018.
