INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

Senate Bill No. 135—AN ACT relating to state employees; authorizing collective bargaining for certain state employees; renaming, revising the membership of and expanding the duties of the Local Government Employee-Management Relations Board; providing for bargaining units of state employees and their representatives; establishing procedures for collective bargaining and for making and amending collective bargaining agreements; prohibiting certain unfair labor practices; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Parks moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Senate Bill No. 136—AN ACT relating to the Tahoe Regional Planning Compact; revising the composition of the board of directors of the Tahoe transportation district; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.
