#### INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By the Committee on Finance:

Senate Bill No. 269—AN ACT making an appropriation to the Department of Health and Human Services for the purpose of expanding the number of persons served by the statewide information and referral system concerning health, welfare, human and social services provided in this State; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Woodhouse moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Motion carried.

By Senators Harris, Ratti, Seevers Gansert and Assemblyman Thompson:

Senate Bill No. 270—AN ACT relating to public welfare; requiring the Department of Health and Human Services to establish and administer the Nevada Crisis Response System; requiring the Nevada Crisis Response System to provide certain services to persons who are transient, at imminent risk of homelessness or homeless; authorizing the Director of the Department to solicit and accept money to carry out the Nevada Crisis Response System; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Harris moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services.

Motion carried.

By Senator Hardy:

Senate Bill No. 271—AN ACT relating to professions; authorizing a physician assistant to provide emergency care in certain emergency situations without the supervision of a physician or osteopathic physician; authorizing a physician to refuse to act as a supervising physician; prohibiting a supervising physician or supervising osteopathic physician from supervising more than 10 physician assistants at the same time; authorizing a supervising physician to supervise a physician assistant in person, electronically, telephonically or by fiber optics; providing that a person may be simultaneously licensed as a physician assistant by the Board of Medical Examiners and the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine; requiring a supervising physician and supervising osteopathic physician to review and initial charts of patients of certain physician assistants; authorizing the Board of Medical Examiners and the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine to adopt certain regulations; adding a physician assistant as a voting member to the Board of Medical Examiners and the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine; providing that a license as a physician assistant is valid for 2 years; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Hardy moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

Motion carried.

By Senators Scheible and Cannizzaro:

Senate Bill No. 272—AN ACT relating to the Public Employees' Retirement System; requiring the State of Nevada to pay to the System the employees' portion of contributions for certain employees; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Scheible moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Motion carried.

By Senators Scheible and Cannizzaro:

Senate Bill No. 273—AN ACT relating to contractors; making various changes to the provisions related to mechanics' and materialmen's liens; revising provisions requiring a lessee to record a notice of security before beginning a work of improvement; providing alternative security for the release of certain liens; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Scheible moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.

By Senators Scheible and Cannizzaro:

Senate Bill No. 274—AN ACT relating to crimes; revising the penalties for certain acts related to discharging a firearm; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

By Senator Goicoechea and Assemblyman Ellison:

Senate Bill No. 275—AN ACT relating to wildlife; creating the Board to License Master Guides and Subguides within the Department of Wildlife; transferring to the Board the powers and duties governing the licensing and regulation of master guides and subguides; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Goicoechea moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.
