The Cannabis Compliance Board has reviewed BDR 56-693 and determined it would have a fiscal impact of \$178,800 in fiscal year 2022 and \$63,200 in fiscal year 2023.

This fiscal impact is based on Section three only of the bill as Section two requiring the Board to review, verify, and validate debts owed to independent cannabis testing laboratories, notify affected parties, track progress and implement penalties should debt fail to be paid will be removed through amendment as indicated by the bill sponsor at the original hearing.

Section three requires the Board to implement and maintain an electronic database containing comprehensive information relating to testing conducted on cannabis products by cannabis independent testing laboratories. Additionally under this section, the Board is required to make this information electronically accessible to each licensee and require the Board create and adopt regulations that detail the manner in which a cannabis independent testing laboratory is required to enter results into the database in addition to regulations and procedures that are required for administration of the database, database assumptions are attached.
