AN ACT making an appropriation to the Immigration Clinic at the William S. Boyd School of Law of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas for the purpose of providing pro bono legal services related to immigration law; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State
- 2 General Fund to the Immigration Clinic at the William S. Boyd
- 3 School of Law of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, for the
- 4 purpose of providing pro bono legal services related to immigration
- 5 law, the following sums:
- 6 For the Fiscal Year 2023-2024..... \$500,000
- 7 For the Fiscal Year 2024-2025..... \$500,000
- 8 2. Any balance of the sums appropriated by subsection 1
- 9 remaining at the end of the respective fiscal years must not be
- 10 committed for expenditure after June 30 of the respective fiscal
- 11 years by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity
- 12 to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise



1 transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated
2 money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after
3 September 20, 2024, and September 19, 2025, respectively, by
4 either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity
5 to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and
6 must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before
7 September 20, 2024, and September 19, 2025, respectively.
8 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2023.
