ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Joint
Interim Standing Committee on Government Affairs to
conduct a study of the use of polygraphic examinations on
certain employees.

1 RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE
2 SENATE CONCURRING, That the Joint Interim Standing Committee
3 on Government Affairs is hereby directed to conduct a study during
4 the 2023-2024 interim; and be it further

5 RESOLVED, That the study must include, without limitation, an
6 examination of:

7 1. The methods and procedures used by this State or any
8 political subdivision of this State to conduct polygraphic
9 examinations on prospective employees;

10 2. The accuracy of polygraph instruments used by this State or
11 any political subdivision of this State to conduct polygraphic
12 examinations on prospective employees;

13 3. The degree to which experience, bias, prejudice or other
14 factors may influence how a polygraphic examination is conducted
15 or how the data from a polygraphic examination is interpreted;

16 4. The impact of a requirement to submit to a polygraphic
17 examination on the quality and volume of applicants for
18 employment with this State or any political subdivision of this State;

1 5. Data concerning the number of prospective employees of
2 this State or any political subdivision of this State who are required
3 each year to submit to a polygraphic examination as a condition of
4 employment and decline to do so; and be it further

5 RESOLVED, That any recommended legislation proposed by the
6 Committee must be approved by a majority of the members of the
7 Senate and a majority of the members of the Assembly appointed to
8 the Committee; and be it further

9 RESOLVED, That the Committee, pursuant to subsection 4 of
10 NRS 218E.330, shall submit a report of the study and any
11 recommendations for legislation to the Director of the Legislative
12 Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the 83rd Session of the Nevada
13 Legislature; and be it further

14 RESOLVED, That this resolution becomes effective upon
15 adoption.
