SUMMARY—Creates the Virtual Early Childhood Family Engagement Pilot Program in the Department of Health and Human Services. (BDR S-988)

AN ACT relating to education; creating the Virtual Early Childhood Family Engagement Pilot Program in the Department of Health and Human Services; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 Existing law establishes the Nevada Early Childhood Advisory Council and requires the
2 Council to develop recommendations for: (1) increasing the participation of children in early
3 childhood education programs; and (2) the establishment of statewide standards for early
4 childhood education programs. (NRS 432A.076) **Section 4** of this bill creates the Virtual
5 Early Childhood Family Engagement Pilot Program within the Department of Health and
6 Human Services. **Section 5** of this bill requires the Department to select a nonprofit
7 organization that has demonstrated a record of success in virtual early childhood family
8 engagement programs to administer the Program. **Section 6** of this bill requires the
9 organization selected to administer the Program to: (1) create a plan to recruit parents,
10 guardians and foster parents of children who are eligible to enter kindergarten for the next
11 school year throughout the State to participate in the Program; (2) provide programming in
12 reading, math and science to participating children and their parents, guardians or foster
13 parents in their residences through computers; and (3) provide the parents, guardians and
14 foster parents of children participating in the Program with information concerning relevant
15 government programs. **Section 7** of this bill requires the organization selected to administer
16 the Program to submit an annual report to the Department concerning: (1) the demographics
17 of children who are participating in the Program; and (2) the success of the Program in
18 preparing children for kindergarten. **Section 7** also requires the Department to submit similar
19 reports to the Legislature. **Sections 2 and 3** of this bill define certain terms related to the
20 Program. **Section 8.5 of this bill makes an appropriation to the Department to establish
21 and implement the Program.**

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** As used in sections 1 to 7, inclusive, of this act, unless the context
2 otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in sections 2 and 3 of this act have
3 the meaning ascribed to them in those sections.

4 **Sec. 2.** “Department” means the Department of Health and Human Services.

5 **Sec. 3.** “Program” means the Virtual Early Childhood Family Engagement
6 Pilot Program created by section 4 of this act.

7 **Sec. 4.** 1. The Virtual Early Childhood Family Engagement Pilot Program
8 is hereby created within the Department.

9 2. The purposes of the Program are to:

10 (a) Provide training and coaching to empower parents and guardians of young
11 children in the education of their child; and

12 (b) Increase the readiness of children for kindergarten in every geographic area
13 of this State.

14 **Sec. 5.** 1. The Department shall issue a request for proposals from
15 organizations that are recognized as exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal
16 Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3), to administer the Program.

17 2. The Department shall review the proposals submitted to the Department
18 pursuant to subsection 1 and select to administer the Program an organization that
19 has a record of success conducting virtual early childhood family engagement
20 programs, as demonstrated through independent, valid and reliable evaluations.

21 **Sec. 6.** 1. The organization selected to administer the Program pursuant to
22 section 5 of this act shall:

23 (a) Create a plan to recruit parents, guardians and foster parents of children
24 described in paragraph (a) of subsection 2 who are from diverse backgrounds and
25 all geographic areas of the State to participate in the Program;

26 (b) Provide the programming described in paragraph (b) of subsection 2 to
27 such children and their parents, guardians or foster parents in their residences
28 through a computer or similar device;

29 (c) Provide for the installation of a computer or Internet service if the residence
30 of the child or parent, guardian or foster parent lacks such a device or service;

31 (d) Effectively engage the parents, guardians and foster parents who participate
32 in the Program to empower them in the education of their children; and

33 (e) At least twice during each school year that a child participates in the
34 Program, and upon request of the parent, guardian or foster parent of a child who is
35 participating in the Program, provide such parents, guardians or foster parents
36 information in electronic form or in writing concerning relevant services and
37 resources provided by the State and relevant political subdivisions of this State,
38 including, without limitation:

39 (1) Any program that provides:

40 (I) Rental and housing assistance; or

41 (II) Subsidies for child care;

42 (2) The Kinship Guardianship Assistance Program established and
43 administered by the Department pursuant to NRS 432B.622;

44 (3) Preschools that provide in-person instruction;

45 (4) Registration for kindergarten;

46 (5) Medicaid and the Children’s Health Insurance Program;

47 (6) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, as defined in NRS
48 422A.080;

49 (7) Supplemental Nutrition Assistance, as defined in NRS 422A.072;

1 (8) Early intervention services, as defined in NRS 427A.8715; and

2 (9) Programs for workforce development.

3 2. The Program must:

4 (a) Serve children who will be eligible to enter kindergarten for the next school
5 year, including, without limitation, children:

6 (1) Whose household has an income which is not more than 200 percent of
7 the federally designated level signifying poverty;

8 (2) Who are in the foster care system; or

9 (3) Who reside in rural areas of this State.

10 (b) Utilize a developmentally appropriate, adaptive curriculum in reading,
11 mathematics and science for the Program that:

12 (1) Is aligned to the *Head Start Early Learning Outcomes Framework:
13 Ages Birth to Five* published by the Office of Head Start of the Administration for
14 Children and Families of the United States Department of Health and Human
15 Services and any standards of content and performance established for
16 prekindergarten pursuant to NRS 389.520;

17 (2) Is aligned to the *WIDA Early Language Development Standards*
18 prescribed by *WIDA*;

19 (3) Is certified as a Certified Autism Resource by the International Board
20 of Credentialing and Continuing Education Standards; and

21 (4) Is endorsed by the Council of Administrators of Special Education.

22 (c) Ensure that the time a child is required by the Program to use a digital
23 screen is less than the maximum amount of time recommended by the American
24 Academy of Pediatrics for children who are 4 years of age to use a digital screen.

25 **Sec. 7.** 1. On or before July 30, 2024, and July 30, 2025, the organization
26 selected to administer the Program pursuant to section 5 of this act shall submit a
27 report to the Department which includes, without limitation:

28 (a) The number of children enrolled in the Program during the immediately
29 preceding school year, in total and in each county of this State;

30 (b) The number and percentage of children described in paragraph (a) who
31 meet each criterion identified in paragraph (a) of subsection 2 of section 6 of this
32 act;

33 (c) The demographics of the children enrolled in the Program, if known,
34 including, without limitation:

35 (1) Race;

36 (2) Ethnicity;

37 (3) Disability status;

38 (4) Household income;

39 (5) County of residence; and

40 (6) Language spoken at home;

41 (d) Quantitative data and, to the extent any is available, qualitative data that
42 demonstrates the effectiveness of the Program at improving the abilities of a child
43 in reading, writing and mathematics and the readiness of the children participating
44 in the Program for kindergarten, including, without limitation:

45 (1) Data concerning the educational development of the children
46 participating in the Program;

47 (2) The number of children who completed the Program and who are ready
48 for kindergarten; and

49 (3) Data concerning the level of satisfaction that parents, guardians and
50 foster parents have concerning the Program; and

51 (e) Any additional information determined by the Department to be necessary
52 to evaluate the Program.

1 2. On or before September 30, 2024, and September 30, 2025, the Department
2 shall compile a report of the data reported pursuant to subsection 1 and submit the
3 report to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to:

4 (a) In 2024, the next regular session of the Legislature; and

5 (b) In 2025, the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Education and the Joint
6 Interim Standing Committee on Health and Human Services.

7 **Sec. 8.** (Deleted by amendment.)

8 **Sec. 8.5. 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund**
9 **to the Department of Health and Human Services to establish and implement**
10 **the Virtual Early Childhood Family Engagement Pilot Program created by**
11 **section 4 of this act the following sums:**

12 For the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 \$1,000,000

13 For the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 \$1,000,000

14 **2. Any balance of the sums appropriated by subsection 1 of this act**
15 **remaining at the end of the respective fiscal years must not be committed for**
16 **expenditure after June 30 of the respective fiscal years by the entity to which**
17 **the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the**
18 **appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any**
19 **portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any**
20 **purpose after September 20, 2024, and September 19, 2025, respectively, by**
21 **either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which**
22 **the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to**
23 **the State General Fund on or before September 20, 2024, and September 19,**
24 **2025, respectively.**

25 **Sec. 9.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2023, and expires by limitation
26 on September 30, 2025.
