SUMMARY—Makes appropriations to the Interim Finance Committee for allocation to school districts that budget salary increases for certain employees and to the Department of Education for certain personnel costs. (BDR S-508)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact.  
Effect on the State: Contains Appropriation not included in Executive Budget.

AN ACT making an appropriation to the Interim Finance Committee for allocation to school districts that budget salary increases for certain employees; making an appropriation to the Department of Education for certain personnel costs; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State  
2 General Fund to the Interim Finance Committee the sum of



1 \$250,000,000 for allocation to school districts for the support of  
2 public schools.

3 2. Money appropriated by subsection 1 may only be allocated  
4 to a school district upon the determination of the Interim Finance  
5 Committee that:

6 (a) Sufficient documentation has been submitted to demonstrate  
7 that:

8 (1) The school district has budgeted for Fiscal Years 2023-  
9 2024 and 2024-2025 an increase to the salary of teachers and  
10 education support professionals employed by the school district  
11 from sources other than the appropriation made by subsection 1,  
12 which is in addition to any increase in salary for teachers or  
13 education support professionals which was planned or bargained for  
14 before the effective date of this act; and

15 (2) The increase in salary budgeted pursuant to subparagraph  
16 (1) does not replace or supplant any other form of compensation  
17 which was provided to teachers or education support professionals  
18 of the school district before Fiscal Year 2023-2024 or which was  
19 bargained for or planned for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 or any  
20 succeeding fiscal year before the effective date of this act.

21 (b) The school district has submitted to the Committee a  
22 statement of the amount and percentage of the budgeted increase in  
23 salary for teachers and education support professionals described in  
24 subparagraph (1) of paragraph (a) and the total cost to the school  
25 district to provide the budgeted increase in salary.

26 (c) The superintendent of the school district has submitted to the  
27 Committee a signed statement certifying that, to the best of his or  
28 her knowledge or belief, the information submitted pursuant to  
29 paragraph (b) is accurate and that the school district will provide the  
30 budgeted salary increases set forth therein.

31 3. The money allocated to a school district pursuant to  
32 subsection 2 must not exceed the lesser of:

33 (a) The total amount of the budgeted increase to salaries for  
34 teachers and education support professionals of the school district  
35 for Fiscal Years 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 from sources other than  
36 the appropriation made by subsection 1, not including any increase  
37 in salary which was planned or bargained for before the effective  
38 date of this act; or

39 (b) An amount which is equal to \$250,000,000 multiplied by a  
40 percentage which is the number of teachers and education support  
41 professionals employed by the school district on July 1, 2023,  
42 expressed as a percentage of the total number of teachers and  
43 education support professionals employed in all of the school  
44 districts in this State on July 1, 2023.



1 4. On or before August 1, 2023, each school district in this  
2 State shall report to the Department of Education the number of  
3 teachers and education support professionals employed by the  
4 school district on July 1, 2023. The Department of Education shall  
5 compile this information and submit it to the Interim Finance  
6 Committee not later than August 15, 2023.

7 5. The money appropriated by subsection 1 must be used to  
8 supplement and not supplant or cause to be reduced any other source  
9 of funding for the support of public schools or for the salary and  
10 compensation of teachers or education support professionals  
11 employed by any public school.

12 6. On or before August 1, 2024, and August 1, 2025, each  
13 school district in this State that is allocated money pursuant to  
14 subsection 2 during Fiscal Year 2023-2024 and Fiscal Year 2024-  
15 2025, respectively, shall submit a report to the Interim Finance  
16 Committee which includes, without limitation:

17 (a) Detailed information on how all money allocated pursuant to  
18 subsection 2 was spent by the school district;

19 (b) The actual increase to the salary of teachers and education  
20 support professionals employed by the school district during the  
21 immediately preceding fiscal year and the amount of such an  
22 increase for which money allocated pursuant to subsection 2 was  
23 spent; and

24 (c) Any other information relating to the use by the school  
25 district of the money allocated pursuant to subsection 2, or the  
26 operations of the school district to provide appropriate context for  
27 such use, which is requested by the Interim Finance Committee.

28 7. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by  
29 subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30,  
30 2025, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity  
31 to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise  
32 transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated  
33 money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after  
34 September 19, 2025, by either the entity to which the money was  
35 appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently  
36 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General  
37 Fund on or before September 19, 2025.

38 8. As used in this section:

39 (a) "Administrator" has the meaning ascribed to it in  
40 NRS 385A.430.

41 (b) "Education support professional" means a person, other than  
42 a teacher or administrator, who is employed to work at a public  
43 school, including, without limitation:

44 (1) Paraprofessionals;



1 (2) School police officers, school resource officers and other  
2 providers of security services at a school;

3 (3) School nurses;

4 (4) School counselors;

5 (5) School psychologists;

6 (6) School social workers;

7 (7) Drivers of school buses;

8 (8) Secretaries;

9 (9) Members of the custodial or maintenance staff; and

10 (10) Workers in food services.

11 (c) "Teacher" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 385A.430.

12 **Sec. 1.5.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State  
13 General Fund to the Department of Education the sum of \$41,694  
14 for personnel costs to carry out the provisions of section 1 of this  
15 act.

16 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by  
17 subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30,  
18 2024, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity  
19 to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise  
20 transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated  
21 money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after  
22 September 20, 2024, by either the entity to which the money was  
23 appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently  
24 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General  
25 Fund on or before September 20, 2024.

26 **Sec. 2.** 1. This section and section 1 of this act become  
27 effective upon passage and approval.

28 2. Section 1.5 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2023.
