The agency has reviewed the bill and determined there is a fiscal impact. In Section 1(6) (a-e) the bill changes the age that financial assistance is provided to adoptive families of a youth with special needs is extended. The financial assistances would be extended to 18 years of age if not enrolled in school or age 19 if the child is enrolled in school and ends if the child graduates from high school or becomes self-supporting, is emancipated, or dies. The agency has determined that this will have a fiscal impact on the amount of adoption subsidies paid each year in each jurisdiction.
