AB233 / BDR 15-764 is an act relating to crimes; increasing the penalties for certain crimes relating to children under certain circumstances; and providing other matters.

This bill provides that a person who is convicted of a second or subsequent offense of abuse or neglect of a child, where the child suffered substantial bodily or mental harm but such harm is not the result of sexual abuse or exploitation of a child who is less than 14 years of age, is guilty of a category B felony and must be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for a minimum term of not less than 8 years and a maximum term of not more than 20 years.

If this bill as introduced is enacted, it would require the Department of Public Safety, Records Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD), Nevada Offense Code Unit (NOC) staff to create 2 new NOCs and 2 new subtypes. However, the cumulative impact of the legislation from the 2023 session will increase the volume of NOC revisions. The RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2023-2025 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
