AB270 / BDR 54-714 is an act relating to providers of health care; providing for the licensure and regulation of anesthesiologist assistants; requiring work under the supervision; establishing the maximum fee; exempting anesthesiologist assistant from civil liability; requiring anesthesiologist assistant to report neglect or abuse; authorizing anesthesiologist assistant to be simultaneously licensed; providing penalties; and other matters.

Section 39 of this bill provide that a person who holds himself or herself out as an anesthesiologist assistant without being licensed as such by the Board is guilty of a category C or D felony.

If this bill as introduced is enacted, it would require the Department of Public Safety, Records Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD), Nevada Offense Code Unit (NOC) staff to modify 5 NOCs. However, the cumulative impact of the legislation from the 2023 session will increase the volume of NOC revisions. The RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2023-2025 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
