On each weekday the Nevada Legislature is in Session and on such other days that the Senate is convened, a cumulative daily history of those actions is released to the Internet and is available on the Nevada Legislature's website.

At any time during the Session, the location of a bill or resolution and the latest information on the current step of enactment may be obtained by accessing the Nevada Legislature's website at www.leg.state.nv.us or the Nevada Electronic Legislative Information System at [NELIS](#).

The history volumes contain: the names of the Officers of the Nevada State Senate; the Orders of Business; the names, district numbers and addresses of members; Senate Session staff names, position titles and residences; names and members of Standing Committees; Senate Leadership designations; and a diagram of the Senate Chamber seating arrangement. Additional information may be obtained from the Nevada Senate's website and through the offices of the Legal and Research Divisions of the Legislative Counsel Bureau.

The daily histories are cumulative. Every two weeks, a history volume is released to the Nevada Legislature's website. Senate history volumes are also cumulative, and they contain all the legislative action on bills and resolutions up to and including the date on the volume, which is numbered consecutively with Roman numerals. Each successive volume supersedes the previous version.

**JOINT STANDING RULE No. 14.3 OF THE
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY
Eighty-second Session, 2023**

The Joint Standing Rules of the Senate and Assembly (Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 1) were adopted by both Houses of the Nevada State Legislature. Joint Standing Rule No. 14.3 provided for deadlines for the enactment of bills and joint resolutions during the 82nd Session of the Nevada State Legislature.

No further legislative action was allowed on a bill or joint resolution that failed to meet the established deadline toward passage and enactment. Senate and Assembly bills and joint resolutions that did not meet the required deadlines have the specific portion of Joint Standing Rule No. 14.3 cited that pertained to each legislative measure. The date notation preceding the rule citation in the history of the bill or joint resolution is the date whereby no further action could be taken.

SCHEDULE FOR ENACTMENT OF BILLS

Rule No. 14.3. Final Dates for Action by Standing Committees and Houses

Except as otherwise provided in Joint Standing Rules Nos. 14.4, 14.5 and 14.6:

1. The final standing committee to which a bill or joint resolution is referred in its House of origin may only take action on the bill or joint resolution on or before the 68th calendar day of the legislative session (**April 14, 2023**). A bill may be re-referred after that date only to the Senate Committee on Finance or the Assembly Committee on Ways and Means and only if the bill is exempt pursuant to subsection 1 of Joint Standing Rule No. 14.6.

2. Final action on a bill or joint resolution may only be taken by the House of origin on or before the 79th calendar day of the legislative session (**April 25, 2023**).

3. The final standing committee to which a bill or joint resolution is referred in the second House may only take action on the bill or joint resolution on or before the 103rd calendar day of the legislative session (**May 19, 2023**). A bill may be re-referred after that date only to the Senate Committee on Finance or the Assembly Bill is exempt pursuant to subsection 1 of Joint Standing Rule No. 14.6.

4. Final action on a bill or joint resolution may only be taken by the second House on or before the 110th calendar day of the legislative session (**May 26, 2023**).

SENATE STANDING RULE No. 112.4
Eighty-second Session, 2023

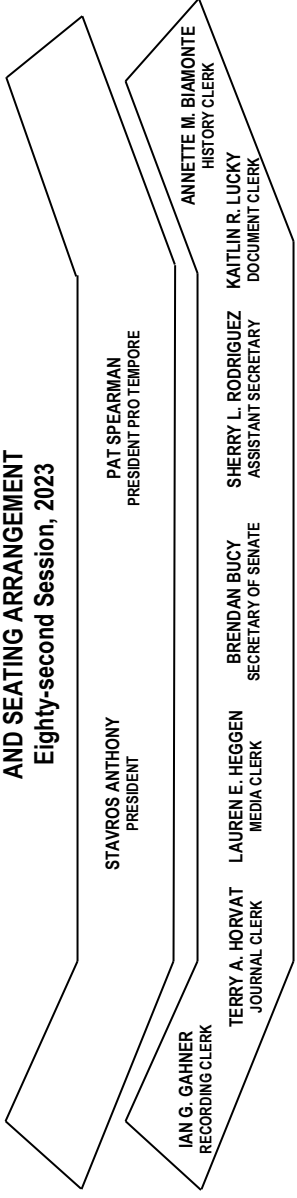
The Senate Standing Rules (Senate Resolution No. 1) were adopted by the Nevada State Senate on February 6, 2023. Senate Standing Rule No. 112.4 provided that if all Senators who sponsored the introduction of a Senate bill or resolution removed their names as sponsors of said bill or resolution and no other Senator added his or her name as a sponsor of the bill or resolution, the bill or resolution would be considered dead for the remainder of the 82nd Legislative Session and no further action would be allowed.

Any Senate bill or resolution that was affected by this rule contains the date notation preceding the rule citation in the history of the bill or resolution as the date whereby no further action could be taken.

SPONSORSHIP

Rule No. 112.4. If a Senator who is the only sponsor of a bill or resolution that was introduced in the Senate removes his or her name from the bill or resolution while the bill or resolution is in the Senate and no other senator adds his or her name as the sponsor of the bill or resolution at the time of the request for removal, no further action on the bill or resolution is allowed for that legislative session.
