#### INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

Assembly Bill No. 376—AN ACT relating to insurance; requiring the Commissioner of Insurance to establish and administer the Regulatory

Experimentation Program for Insurance Product Innovation; setting forth requirements for the operation of the Program; authorizing an insurer to implement a proposed increase in a rate for certain kinds and lines of insurance while the proposal is pending approval or disapproval by the Commissioner; setting forth certain requirements applicable in the event that such a proposal is ultimately disapproved; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Marzola moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

Assembly Bill No. 378—AN ACT relating to controlled substances; creating the Alternative Therapy Pilot Program; requiring the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human Services to administer and adopt certain regulations governing the Program; authorizing the Division to take certain actions with respect to the Program; requiring the Division to authorize at least one person to cultivate, manufacture or produce psychedelic substances for use in the Program; requiring the Division to submit to the Legislature an annual report concerning the Program; providing immunity from civil, criminal and administrative liability to a participant in the Program for certain conduct relating to the Program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assembly Bill No. 384—AN ACT relating to juvenile justice; requiring a juvenile facility to create and maintain, for certain purposes, certain records relating to certain acts of violence committed by a child in the facility; revising provisions relating to the admission or placement of certain children in certain facilities under certain circumstances; requiring the Chief of the Youth Parole Bureau of the Division of Child and Family Services of the Department of Health and Human Services to perform certain duties relating to children who are paroled from certain facilities; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Miller moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Assembly Bill No. 385—AN ACT relating to governmental administration; prohibiting the governing body of certain counties and cities from taking certain actions to prohibit the use of cooling towers which use water for certain projects; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assembly Bill No. 386—AN ACT relating to education; requiring the State Board of Education to approve at least two assessments which may be used to assess the literacy of pupils enrolled in an elementary school; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assembly Bill No. 387—AN ACT relating to guardianship; revising provisions relating to service of certain notices, petitions and citations relating to guardianships of minors; revising provisions relating to the appointment, modification, removal or termination of guardianships of minors; revising provisions relating to the powers and duties of guardians of minors; revising provisions relating to the management of the estates, property and other assets of protected minors; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.
