INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By Assemblymember Brown-May:

Assembly Bill No. 407—AN ACT relating to trade practices; requiring an original equipment manufacturer of certain digital electronic equipment or a powered wheelchair to make available certain documentation, parts and tools for the diagnosis, maintenance or repair of the equipment or wheelchair; setting forth various exceptions from that requirement; requiring an independent repair provider to post, publish and provide certain information; prohibiting an original equipment manufacturer from engaging in certain acts; exempting an original equipment manufacturer from liability for certain damage or injuries under certain circumstances; providing for the enforcement of the provisions governing original equipment manufacturers and independent repair providers by the Attorney General; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Marzola moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

Motion carried.

By Assemblymember Yurek:

Assembly Bill No. 408—AN ACT relating to victims of crime; repealing, replacing and revising certain provisions requiring the notification of certain victims of crime upon changes in the custody status of an offender related to release, escape, residential confinement, clemency and parole; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Miller moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.

By Assemblymembers Hafen, D’Silva, Brown-May and Torres-Fossett:

Assembly Bill No. 409—AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; requiring the Department of Motor Vehicles, under certain circumstances, to issue a special license plate to a veteran of the Space Force; authorizing the combination of personalized prestige license plates and certain special license plates associated with military service; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Watts moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Growth and Infrastructure.

By Assemblymembers Gray, Cole, Edgeworth, Gurr and Koenig:

Assembly Bill No. 410—AN ACT relating to crimes; revising provisions relating to the crime of assault; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Miller moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Assemblymember Jauregui:

Assembly Bill No. 411—AN ACT relating to prescription drugs; revising provisions relating to the labeling of certain prescription drugs under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Brown-May moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services.

Motion carried.

By Assemblymembers Dalia and Jauregui:

Assembly Bill No. 412—AN ACT relating to emergency response; creating the Account for the Nevada School Safety Data Grant Program within the Department of Public Safety to award grants to school districts to procure school mapping data for schools in this State; prescribing certain requirements for the use of grants received from the Account; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Torres-Fossett moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Education.

Motion carried.

By Assemblymember Nguyen:

Assembly Bill No. 413—AN ACT relating to workforce development; providing for the creation of the Southern Nevada Health Care Workforce Apprenticeship Pilot Program; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Marzola moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

Motion carried.

By Assemblymembers Moore, Carter, D'Silva and Karris; Senators Flores, Scheible and Doñate:

Assembly Bill No. 414—AN ACT relating to occupational safety; revising the requirements of written safety programs in certain workplaces to include programs related to mitigation of heat illness and certain air quality issues; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Marzola moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

Motion carried.

By Assemblymembers Carter and Goulding; Senators Titus, Taylor and Lange:

Assembly Bill No. 415—AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; revising provisions governing the disposition of certain vehicles abandoned on public or private property; revising the value of a vehicle for which a junk certificate may be issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles; prohibiting the operator of a tow car from falsely reporting the location of the operator or tow car to a law enforcement agency for certain purposes; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Watts moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Growth and Infrastructure.

Motion carried.

By Assemblymembers Miller, La Rue Hatch, Anderson, Considine, González and Moore:

Assembly Bill No. 416—AN ACT relating to education; prohibiting the board of trustees of a school district, the governing body of a charter school or a school employee from limiting access to library materials by pupils under certain circumstances; prohibiting certain actions against the members of the board of trustees of a school district, the members of the governing body of a charter school, school employees, pupils and certain other persons which are intended to limit access to library materials by pupils; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Miller moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Assemblymembers Hunt, Considine, D'Silva, Flanagan, Karris and Nadeem:

Assembly Bill No. 417—AN ACT relating to public safety; establishing provisions relating to the inspection of certain vehicles; revising provisions relating to the rescission and cancellation of the registration of a vehicle under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblymember Watts moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Growth and Infrastructure.
