INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By Senators Doñate and Flores:

Senate Bill No. 233—AN ACT relating to agriculture; requiring the Director of the State Department of Agriculture to establish a program to certify certain food and farm products as grown or produced in Nevada and to certify the vendors of such food or farm products; requiring the State Department of Agriculture to establish a Task Force on Farm Labor; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Doñate moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

Motion carried.

By Senators Doñate, Flores, Ohrenschall and Taylor; Assemblymembers Moore, Roth, Torres-Fossett, González, Anderson, D'Silva and Nguyen:

Senate Bill No. 234—AN ACT relating to Medicaid; requiring Medicaid to provide certain limited coverage to certain persons who would otherwise be ineligible for Medicaid because of their immigration status; prescribing the scope and limitations of such coverage; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Doñate moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services.

Motion carried.

By Senator Hansen:

Senate Bill No. 235—AN ACT relating to wildlife; revising provisions governing the establishment of a program which authorizes a person to transfer his or her tag to hunt a big game mammal to any person who is under 18 years of age; revising provisions relating to the exhibition or possession of certain licenses, permits or related items while engaged in certain activities concerning wildlife; authorizing a person to take or gather a skull or head of a wildlife species without a tag for non-commercial purposes; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Hansen moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

Motion carried.

By Senators Stone, Ellison, Krasner and Buck:

Senate Bill No. 236—AN ACT relating to real property; defining the terms “squatter” and “tenant” for certain purposes relating to summary proceedings for obtaining possession of real property, a recreational vehicle or a mobile

home; reducing the period for seeking reentry of a dwelling and the return of personal property contained therein under certain circumstances; revising provisions governing the crime of unlawful occupancy; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Stone moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary. Motion carried.
