## INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By Senators Flores, Doñate and Scheible; Assemblymembers Moore, González and D'Silva:

Senate Bill No. 260—AN ACT relating to employment; establishing requirements for certain employers relating to the exposure of employees to poor air quality in the workplace; prohibiting an employer from disciplining or retaliating against an employee who reports certain information relating to poor air quality; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Flores moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

Motion carried.

By Senators Doñate, Krasner, Stone, Hansen, Daly and Nguyen and Assemblymember Gallant:

Senate Bill No. 261—AN ACT relating to housing; authorizing certain persons to file a complaint to request that a sheriff remove an unlawful or unauthorized occupant of a dwelling on the real property of the person; requiring the Administrator of the Housing Division of the Department of Business and Industry to prescribe by regulation a form to authorize a local law enforcement agency to enter certain properties that are listed for sale when a person forcibly enters or detains such a property; authorizing a sheriff to collect certain fees for serving a notice to vacate and for performing certain other actions; revising the crime of forcible detainer; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Doñate moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.

By Senators Pazina, Dondero Loop, Cannizzaro, Doñate, Nguyen, Cruz-Crawford, Daly, Flores, Lange, Ohrenschall, Scheible and Taylor; Assemblymembers Marzola, Monroe-Moreno, Brown-May, Considine, Watts, Anderson, Backus, Dalia, D'Silva, Flanagan, González, Goulding, Hunt, Jackson, Karris, La Rue Hatch, Moore, Mosca, Nadeem, Nguyen, Orentlicher, Roth and Torres-Fossett:

Senate Bill No. 262—AN ACT relating to health care; transferring the administration of the Graduate Medical Education Grant Program and the Account for the Program from the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology in the Office of the Governor to the Department of Health and Human Services; expanding the purposes for which institutions that provide programs of residency training in this State may receive grants under the Program; making an appropriation to the Account for the Program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Pazina moved that Senate Standing Rule No. 40 be suspended and that the bill be referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services.

Motion carried.

By Senators Cannizzaro, Pazina, Dondero Loop, Nguyen and Doñate; Assemblymembers Dalia, Hardy, Gray, Yeager and Marzola:

Senate Bill No. 263—AN ACT relating to crimes; expanding certain prohibitions relating to pornography involving minors; revising the penalties for certain crimes relating to pornography involving minors; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Cannizzaro moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.

By Senator Stone:

Senate Bill No. 264—AN ACT relating to crimes; revising provisions governing the crime of burglary of a business; revising provisions governing the crime of organized retail theft; lowering the monetary threshold for the classification of certain theft and related offenses; providing a penalty for certain conduct determined to be habitual theft; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Stone moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.
