INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By Senator Rogich; Assemblymembers Nguyen and Edgeworth:

Senate Bill No. 265—AN ACT relating to governmental administration; imposing certain requirements and prohibitions on a state or local governmental agency that collects certain demographic information; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Rogich moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Motion carried.

By Senators Taylor, Cruz-Crawford, Cannizzaro, Daly, Doñate, Dondero Loop, Flores, Ohrenschall, Pazina and Scheible:

Senate Bill No. 266—AN ACT relating to health care; authorizing certain providers of behavioral health services to participate in the Student Loan Repayment for Providers of Health Care in Underserved Communities Program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Taylor moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Motion carried.

By Senator Ellison and Assemblymember Gurr:

Senate Bill No. 267—AN ACT relating to law enforcement; requiring a county or city jail or detention facility to notify federal immigration authorities under certain circumstances; revising certain requirements related to model policies which provide guidance and training recommendations to state or local law enforcement agencies and are published by the Attorney General; repealing certain provisions related to the questioning of a prisoner about immigration status; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Ellison moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.

By Senator Flores:

Senate Bill No. 268—AN ACT relating to insurance; requiring certain health insurance to include coverage for certain dental services when provided by certain dental hygienists without the supervision of a dentist to the same extent

as if provided by a dental hygienist under the supervision of a dentist; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Flores moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

Motion carried.

By Senator Titus:

Senate Bill No. 269—AN ACT relating to taxation; establishing a credit against the modified business tax for taxpayers who donate money to the Graduate Medical Education Grant Program established and administered by the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology within the Office of the Governor; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Titus moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Revenue and Economic Development.

Motion carried.

By Senator Nguyen:

Senate Bill No. 270—AN ACT relating to governmental administration; requiring each contractor and subcontractor on a public work or a project paid for in whole or in part by public funds to produce certain documents for inspection upon request from certain entities; requiring a contractor or subcontractor to provide the representative of a joint labor-management committee reasonable access to a public work to monitor compliance with requirements relating to the use of apprenticeships and the payment of prevailing wages; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Nguyen moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Motion carried.

By Senator Titus and Assemblymember Jauregui:

Senate Bill No. 271—AN ACT making an appropriation to the Division of Public and Behavioral Health of the Department of Health and Human Services for carrying out a nurse apprentice program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Titus moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Motion carried.

By Senators Krasner, Stone, Buck, Steinbeck, Nguyen and Pazina:

Senate Bill No. 272—AN ACT relating to interscholastic activities; requiring the Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association to adopt regulations setting forth the process by which a pupil who transfers schools may appeal a determination of eligibility to participate in any sanctioned sport or other interscholastic activity or event at the school under certain circumstances; requiring that any regulations adopted by the Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association relating to the eligibility to participate in any sanctioned sport or other interscholastic activity or event at the school to

which the pupil transfers authorize a pupil to demonstrate a hardship by providing certain evidence; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Krasner moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Education.

Motion carried.

By the Committee on Government Affairs:

Senate Bill No. 273—AN ACT relating to confidential information; authorizing certain civilian employees that provide support services to a law enforcement agency to request that certain personal information be kept in a confidential manner; authorizing such persons to request that the Department of Motor Vehicles display an alternate address on the person's driver's license, commercial driver's license or identification card; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Flores moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Motion carried.

By the Committee on Government Affairs:

Senate Bill No. 274—AN ACT relating to governmental administration; requiring certain public bodies to submit a list of qualified persons to the Governor to fill vacancies on a board, commission or similar body within 60 days after the vacancy occurs; revising the manner in which the Chair and Vice Chair of the Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission are selected; revising reporting requirements by certain licensing boards and other regulatory bodies concerning the criminal histories of certain applicants; repealing the requirement that the Sunset Subcommittee review certain licensing boards and other regulatory bodies regarding restrictions on the criminal histories of certain applicants; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Flores moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Motion carried.

By Senator Cannizzaro:

Senate Bill No. 275—AN ACT relating to domestic relations; prohibiting a court with jurisdiction over a child custody proceeding from taking certain actions for the sole purpose of improving a deficient relationship between a child and a parent of the child under certain circumstances; prohibiting any such court from ordering a child to receive reunification treatment under certain circumstances; requiring any such court to consider certain evidence in making certain findings relating to allegations of domestic violence or child abuse; requiring a judge who presides over a child custody proceeding and certain other persons to complete certain training relating to domestic violence and child abuse; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Cannizzaro moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.
