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SPECIAL SESSION OF 1920

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THE FIRST DAY

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CARSON CITY (Saturday), February 7, 1920.

Pursuant to proclamation issued by the Governor on the 27th day of January, 1920, the Assembly was called to order by D. J. Fitzgerald, Speaker of the House of the Twenty-ninth Session of the Assembly, at 11 a. m., J. H. Causten, acting as Chief Clerk.

Mr. Speaker instructed the acting Chief Clerk to read the proclamation of the Governor calling the extraordinary session.

The roll was called:

Absent—Bachman, Baird, Booher, Burt, Chandler, Farris, Frederickson, Gibson, Murphy, Phillips, and Wadsworth—11.

Prayer by Rev. Mr. Mook.

Mr. Speaker appointed the following committee to notify the Governor that the Assembly was in regular session, and ready to receive any communication that he might wish to deliver: Messrs. Uniacke, Stewart, and Stodieck.

Mr. Speaker appointed the following committee to notify the Senate that the Assembly was in regular session, and ready to receive any communication that the Senate might wish to deliver: Messrs. Richards, Meder, and McCall.

The Speaker appointed the following Committee on Mileage: Messrs. Whitacre, Lockhart, and Stannard.

Mr. Uniacke, chairman of committee to notify the Governor, reported that the committee had performed its duty.

The Governor arrived.

Mr. Lockhart moved, duly seconded, that a committee be appointed to invite the Senate to meet in joint session with the Assembly for the reading of the Governor's message.

Carried.

The Speaker appointed the following committee: Messrs. Lockhart, Marsh, and Ernest.

A committee from the Senate arrived to notify the Assembly that the Senate was now in session and ready to receive any message that the Assembly desired to send.

Mr. Richards, chairman of the committee to notify the Senate, reported that the committee had performed its duty.

Mr. Lockhart, chairman of the committee to invite the Senate to meet in joint session with Assembly, reported that the committee had performed its duty, and that the Senate would meet with the Assembly in about five minutes.

The Senate arrived.

The Speaker welcomed the Senate and invited them to take their places with their respective delegations.

### IN JOINT SESSION

At 11:10 a. m. the House convened in joint session, with President Sullivan of the Senate presiding.

Governor Boyle read his message as follows:

CARSON CITY, February 7, 1920.

*To the Honorable, the Senate and the Assembly:*

You have been called in extraordinary session for the one purpose of acting on the resolution of the Congress of the United States proposing the extension of the voting franchise to the women citizens of the Nation.

While no certainty exists that the favorable action of Nevada will in 1920 assure to the women of the United States the same voting privileges which our own women enjoy by virtue of our state law, it does appear certain that without our favorable action the cause of national suffrage may be delayed for such a time as to withhold the right to vote in a presidential election from millions of the women of America. Under the circumstances it has appeared to me that Nevada may well at this time live up to her chivalrous traditions. That your individual members have joined with me in this view has been made evident by your own expressions to state leaders in the movement.

I trust that the business of ratification may be conducted expeditiously.

On behalf of the people of the State, I may officially thank each and every member of this body for a spirit of cooperation in this enterprise which admirably exemplifies the traditional generosity of Nevadans in all public matters affecting the national welfare.

Permit me to express to each of you personally my own good wishes and the hope that this short session will be in every way a happy and harmonious one.

Mr. Tullis moved, duly seconded, that Assembly Resolution No. 2 be adopted.

Carried.

Mr. Lockhart made a motion, which was duly seconded, that a committee of three be appointed to wait upon one of the Supreme Court Justices and invite him to administer the oath of office to the new attachés.

Carried.

The Speaker appointed the following committee: Messrs. Meder, Marsh, and Ferguson.

Justice Ducker arrived and administered the oath to the following new attachés: Dorothy Mackey, Assistant Chief Clerk; Nina A. Sullivan, Journal Clerk; C. E. Smith, Sergeant-at-Arms; Sam Jones, Messenger.

Mrs. Hurst moved that inasmuch as the women were so greatly indebted to the members of the Assembly for their cooperation, that Rule 58 be suspended for the remaining portion of the session.

Carried unanimously.

A communication from the Secretary of State was read, inclosing a certified resolution of Congress entitled "Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution extending the right of suffrage to women."

Mrs. Hurst introduced as an emergency measure Assembly Joint and Concurrent Resolution No. 1:

ASSEMBLY JOINT AND CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RATIFYING A  
PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE  
UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

WHEREAS, Both houses of the Sixty-sixth Congress of the United States of America, at the first session thereof, by a constitutional majority of two-thirds thereof, made the following proposition to amend the constitution of the United States of America, in the following words, to wit:

JOINT RESOLUTION

*Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the  
United States of America in Congress assembled (two-thirds of each*

*House concurring therein*), That the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several States :

“ARTICLE .....

“The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex.

“Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.”

Therefore, be it

*Resolved by the Assembly of the State of Nevada, the Senate concurring.* That said proposed Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America be, and the same hereby is, ratified by the legislature of the State of Nevada;

That certified copies of this preamble and joint and concurrent resolution be forwarded by the governor of this state to the president of the United States, to the secretary of state of the United States, to the presiding officer of the United States Senate, and to the speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States.

Mrs. Hurst made a motion, which was duly seconded, that rules be suspended, reading so far had be considered first reading, rules further suspended, resolution read second time by title, and referred to Committee on Federal Relations.

Carried.

It was moved and seconded that Assembly recess for ten minutes to enable the Committee on Federal Relations to consider resolution.

Carried.

Assembly Joint and Concurrent Resolution ratifying a proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America.

History and title, as previously recorded, read.

Reported from the Committee on Federal Relations favorably, with the recommendation that it do pass.

Mr. Speaker requested Mrs. Hurst to occupy the Speaker's chair.

Mrs. Hurst in the chair.

Assembly Joint and Concurrent Resolution read third time, and passed by the following vote :

Mr. Speaker resumed the chair.
