NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Hearing for The Adoption of Regulations of The Nevada Board Of Wildlife Commissioners

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing at 9.00 a.m., on March 18, 2000, at the headquarters of Nevada Division of Wildlife, 1100 Valley Road, Reno, Nevada. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulation CGR 278 (LCB File R -00) pertaining to Chapter 501 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

- 1. The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation: The process by which the public may petition the commission regarding the adoption, amendment or repeal of a regulation is not presently established in regulatory form. Therefore, it is proposed to amend Chapter 501 of the Nevada Administrative Code by establishing a procedure and form describing how a person may petition the commission regarding the adoption, filing, amendment or repeal of any regulation, and how quickly the commission responds to such a petition.

STATE OF NEVADA PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS COMMISSION GENERAL REGULATION 278

Authority: NRS 233B.100, 501.105 & 501.181

Notice of Intent: February 16, 2000. Workshop Date: March 17, 2000. Commission Approval: , 2000.

EXPLANATION: Proposes to amend Chapter 501 of the Nevada Administrative Code by establishing a procedure which describes how a person may petition the commission regarding the adoption, filing, amendment or repeal of any regulation, and the form for such a petition.

NOTE: Matter in *italics* is new; matter within brackets [] is to be omitted.

Section 1. Chapter 501 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. Any person may petition the commission requesting the adoption, filing, amendment or repeal of any regulation. The petition must be made in writing on a form provided by the division or in a format substantially similar to the form.
 - 2. The petitioner must provide the following in the petition:
 - a. His full name and mailing address;
 - b. A statement of the need for and purpose of the proposed regulation, including any relevant data, views and arguments;
- c. Either the language or substance of the proposed regulation or a description of the subjects and issues involved;
- d. A statement regarding the estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public, if applicable. This must be stated separately and in each case must include:
 - (I) Both adverse and beneficial effects; and
 - (II) Both immediate and long-term effects;

e. The estimated cost to the division for enforcement of the proposed

regulation, if applicable;

f. A statement whether the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates any regulations of other state or government agencies. If the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates regulations of another state or government agency, the name of each agency.

- g. A statement whether the proposed regulation includes provisions which are more restrictive than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity;
- h. A statement whether the proposed regulation establishes a new fee or increases an existing fee.
 - i. The signature of the petitioner and the date the petition was signed.
- 3. Within 30 days of receipt of the petition, the commission will either deny the petition in writing or initiate regulation making proceedings in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 233B of NRS. For the purpose of this subsection, the receipt date will be the date of the first available public meeting of the commission following the mailing or delivery of the petition by the petitioner.
- Sec. 2. NAC 501.040 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 501.040 Petitioner means a person who [requests]:
- Requests a hearing before the commission pursuant to NAC 501.140 to 501.190, inclusive,
- 2. Submits a petition to the commission regarding the adoption, filing, amendment or repeal of any regulation pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this regulation.
