# PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE NEVADA STATE BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICAL EXAMINERS

## NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.060.

#### Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code 638 NEW LANGUAGE.

1. The need and the purposed of the proposed regulation or amendment.

This new regulation will define the duties that a unlicensed veterinary assistant can perform.

2. Either the terms or the substance of the regulations to be adopted and amended.

A copy of the proposed regulation is attached to this notice.

- (a) Both adverse and beneficial economic effects.

There will be no adverse or beneficial economic effects on the profession or the public.

(b) Both immediate and long-term effects.

Will ultimately raise the standard of care in veterinary medicine.

There will be no cost incurred by the board for enforcement of this regulation.

## Amendment of Nevada Administrative Code 638.053.

## PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE NEVADA STATE BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICAL EXAMINERS

EXPLANATION-Matters underscored are new; matter in brackets  $\biguplus$  is material to be omitted.

#### Section 1. CHAPTER 638 OF NAC IS HEREBY AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

- Sec 2. NAC 638.0165 "Unlicensed veterinary assistant" defined "Unlicensed veterinary assistant" means a person whose training, knowledge, and skills are less that that required for a licensed veterinary technician. The basic tasks performed by unlicensed veterinary assistants may include, but are not limited to feeding, watering, bathing, restraining, transporting, and exercising animals.
- Sec 3. Supervision/Responsibility for Unlicensed Assistants
- 1. Unlicensed veterinary assistants may perform their duties under the direct or indirect supervision of the veterinarian or a licensed veterinary technician.
- 2. The supervising veterinarian of unlicensed veterinary assistant shall be responsible for determining the competency of the unlicensed veterinary assistant in performing these basic tasks.
- 3. Unlicensed veterinary assistant may not perform any animal health care tasks as defined in NAC 638.053.
- Sec 4. 638.053 Prohibited tasks: tasks requiring supervision.
- 1. A licensed veterinary technician may not perform the following tasks of animal health care:
  - (a) Surgery.
  - (b) Diagnosis and prognosis of animal diseases.
- (c) Except as authorized by a veterinarian, prescribe, administer or dispense drugs, medicines or appliances.
- (d) Any other activity which represents the practice of veterinary medicine or which requires the knowledge, skill and training of a licensed veterinarian.
- 2. A licensed veterinary technician in an animal hospital may perform the following tasks under immediate supervision only:
  - (a) Application of casts and splints.
  - (b) Dental extractions.
  - (c) Induction of anesthesia.
  - (d) Assisting a licensed veterinarian in surgery.
  - (e) Euthanasia.
- 3. A licensed veterinary technician in an animal hospital may perform the following tasks under immediate or direct supervision:
  - (a) Endotracheal intubation.
  - (b) Blood administration.
  - (c) Fluid aspiration.
  - (d) Monitoring of vital signs.

- (e) Application of casts for the immobilization of fractures.
- (f) Tasks listed in subsection 4, if the animal is anesthetized.
- (g) External noninvasive ultrasonography
- 4. A licensed veterinary technician in an animal hospital may perform the following tasks under indirect supervision, unless the animal is anesthetized:
  - (a) Teeth cleaning.
  - (b) Administration of enemas.
  - (c) Administration of an electrocardiogram.
  - (d) Application of bandages.
  - (e) Catheterization of an unobstructed bladder.
  - (f) Introduction of food into the stomach through a tube.
  - (g) Ear flushing.
  - [(h) Positioning of animals for X-rays.]
  - (h) [(i)] Operation of X-ray machines.
  - (i) (i) Administration of oral and rectal radio-opaque materials.
  - (j) [(k)] Administration [of oral and topical medications] controlled substances.
  - (k) (1) Starting and restarting of intravenous fluids.
- (l) [(m)] Collection of a laboratory specimen for analysis, including, but not limited to, blood, urine, skin, parasites and microorganisms.
  - (n) Collection of tissue during or after a post-mortem examination by a licensed veterinarian.
  - (o) Administration of intramuscular, subcutaneous or intravenous injections.

No examination within the previous 12 hours is required for the collection of laboratory specimens.
