## The regulations will be presented at the October 24, 2003, Board of Health meeting for adoption, place and time to be determined.

The purpose of the proposed revised regulation for fees, Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 439.500 and NAC 442.222 is to amend existing regulations governing the fee charged to patients for community health nursing services and medical and pharmaceutical supplies. The need for the proposed revision to NAC 439.500 and NAC 442.222 is directly related to the increased costs of medical and pharmaceutical supplies, compliance with federal mandates that were unfunded, and operating expenses. The existing fee schedules were done in 1992 and are calculated to be 65% below the State Agency's actual cost of providing services. The proposed fee increase is calculated to generate revenue sufficient to maintain necessary community health nursing services and medical and pharmaceutical supplies. Without the adoption of the proposed fee increases, the State Agency will collect approximately \$456,391 less than the budgeted costs of providing the necessary community health nursing services to the rural counties. To accommodate the lack of funding, the State Agency will need to decrease community health services, cap patient appointments, and decrease the availability of necessary medical and pharmaceutical supplies.

The proposed fee increases will have an immediate and long term beneficial effect. The fee increases will allow the State Agency to continue providing services to low income, under insured residents of rural Nevada. Additionally, the public will still be able to receive services on a sliding scale fee based on public health prices which are lower in cost than can be obtained through a private provider or emergency room.

There is no anticipated cost to the Health Division for the enforcement of the proposed regulation change. There is no duplication or overlap of federal, state or local government agency's regulations.

## Chapter 439

#### ADMINISTRATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH

#### **FEES**

NAC 439.500 is hereby amended.

NAC 439.500 Fees and donations for provision of services and medications. (NRS 439.150, 439.200)

1. *No one is denied services for the inability to pay.* For persons who are able to pay, the fees to be charged and collected by the Bureau of Community Health of the Health Division for the services and medications provided by the nurses of the bureau are as follows:

- 3. For the purposes of this section, a person will be charged the fees listed in:
- (a) Category I if the annual gross income of *the client's* [his immediate family] *total household income* is not more than 249 percent of the poverty level designated by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.
- (b) Category II if the annual gross income of the *client's* [his immediate family] *total household income* is at least 250 percent of the poverty level designated by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.
