**PROPOSED TEMPORARY REGULATION OF THE
NEVADA STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS**

**NOTICE OF WORKSHOPS
TO SOLICIT COMMENTS ON A PROPOSED REGULATION

NOTICE OF HEARING
FOR ADOPTION OF A REGULATION OF THE
NEVADA STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS**

Workshop Notice: The Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners, 1105 Terminal Way, Suite 301, Reno, Nevada 89502, is proposing the amendment of regulations pertaining to Chapter 630 of the Nevada Administrative Code. Two (2) Workshops have been set for the purpose of soliciting comments from interested persons on the adoption of the amendment to the regulation.

The first workshop will be conducted Tuesday, January 30, 2007, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock a.m., or as soon thereafter as it may be conducted on that date, at the Grant Sawyer State Office Building, 555 E. Washington Avenue, Room #4412E, Las Vegas, Nevada.

The second workshop will be conducted Wednesday, January 31, 2007, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock a.m., or as soon thereafter as it may be conducted on that date, in the conference room at the offices of the Board, at 1105 Terminal Way, Suite 301, Reno, Nevada.

Action – Proposed amendment to NAC Regulations

Amendment to NAC 630.____, Physician assistants to be able to render care in emergency situations at the scene of an accident or a natural or man-made disaster and to make reasonable effort to contact and inform his supervising physician as to location and type of emergency.

Public Hearing Notice: The Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners will hold a public hearing at 10:00 o'clock a.m., on Thursday, February 1, 2007, or as soon thereafter as it may be heard on that date, in the conference room at the offices of the Board, at 1105 Terminal Way, Suite 301, Reno, Nevada. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the amendment of Nevada Administrative Code Section 630. If no interested

person, who is directly affected by the proposed action, appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Board may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

The proposed change to Chapter 630 of the Nevada Administrative Code is set out hereinafter.

- The proposed amendment will not have a direct economic effect on the business of the practice of medicine or any other business or on the public.
- Enforcement of the proposed amendment will not result in an increased cost to the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners.
- To the Board's knowledge, the proposed amendment does not overlap or duplicate the regulations of other state or local governmental agencies or any federal regulations.
- The proposed amendment does not establish any new fees or increases to existing fees.
- The proposed amendment does not affect small businesses in any way.

Persons wishing to comment on the proposed action may appear at the scheduled public hearing or may address their comments, data, views or arguments, in written form, to the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners, 1105 Terminal Way, Suite 301, P.O. Box 7238, Reno, Nevada 89510-7238. Written submissions must be received by the Board on or before five (5) days prior to the date set for the public hearing.

A copy of this notice and the regulation to be amended will be on file at the State Library, 100 N. Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada, for inspection by members of the public during business hours. Additional copies of the notice and the regulation to be amended will be available at the offices of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners, 1105 Terminal Way, Suite 301, Reno, Nevada, and in all counties in which an office of the Board is not maintained, at the main public library, for inspection and copying by members of the public during business hours. This notice and the text of the regulation to be amended are also available in the State of Nevada Register of Administrative Regulations, which is prepared and published monthly by the Legislative Counsel Bureau pursuant to NRS 233B.0653 and on the Internet at <http://www.leg.state.nv.us>. Copies will also be mailed to members of the public upon request. A reasonable fee may be charged for copies if it is deemed necessary.

Upon adoption of any regulation, the agency, if requested to do so by an interested person, either before adoption or within 30 days thereafter, will issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption, and incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against adoption.

AUTHORITY: NRS 630.130

NAC 630.____ is hereby added to read as follows:

NAC 630.____ Physician Assistants rendering emergency care at the scene of an accident or a natural or man-made disaster. (NRS. 630.130, 630.015, 630.271, 630.275, NAC 630.370)

A physician assistant is considered to be and is deemed the agent of his supervising physician in the performance of all practice-related activities. A physician assistant shall not practice without supervision except in life threatening emergencies, such as accident scenes, or in emergency situations such as man-made and natural disaster relief efforts. When practicing in these situations, the physician assistant is not the agent of the supervising physician, and the supervising physician is not responsible or liable for any care rendered by the physician assistant. A physician assistant operating in these circumstances will provide whatever medical care is possible based on the need of the patient and the training, education and experience of the physician assistant. If a licensed physician is available on scene, the physician assistant may take direction from the physician. The physician assistant must make a reasonable effort to contact the supervising physician as soon as possible to advise him of the incident and the physician assistant's role in providing care.
