**ADOPTED TEMPORARY REGULATION OF THE
COMMISSION ON PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS IN EDUCATION**

Filed with the Secretary of State on April 5, 2007

Statutory Authority: NRS 391.019

NAC 391.215 - Endorsement to Teach Art (NRS 385.080) To receive an endorsement to teach art, a person must hold a bachelor's degree and:

1. Have completed an approved program of preparation for teaching art; or
2. Have completed:
 - (a) Thirty-six semester hours in the ~~{philosophy,}~~ principles~~{,}~~ *of the fine and applied arts which includes, but not limited to, the study of art* history, ~~{methods and appreciation of art, the study of the curriculum in fine arts}~~ *design*, drawing, ~~{composition and applied arts,}~~ painting, *digital or graphic arts, ceramics or {and}* sculpture, ~~{crafts and graphic arts}~~ *and photography or printmaking*; and
 - (b) Twenty-two semester hours of professional education which included:
 - (1) Foundations of education;
 - (2) Methods of teaching art in elementary or secondary schools; and
 - (3) Eight semester hours of supervised teaching.

NAC 391.13015 – Major or Minor in Art (NRS 385.080)

1. A comprehensive major in art consists of 36 semester hours in courses of study involving:

The Commission on Professional Standards in Education adopted temporary regulations assigned LCB File No. T026-07 which pertain to chapter 391 of the Nevada Administrative Code on March 9, 2007.

INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code 391:

Notice of Workshop to Solicit Comments on Proposed Regulations was sent to approximately 100 individuals and educational organizations. A workshop was held on March 9, 2007. There was no public comment.

The Notice of Intent to Act Upon a Regulation for public hearing and adoption of the amendments to NAC 391.215 – Endorsement to Teach Art and NAC 391.13015 – Major or Minor in Art were sent to approximately 100 individuals and educational organizations. The public hearing was conducted on March 9, 2007 to provide the opportunity for comments by affected parties and the public. There was public comment. The Commission adopted the proposed amendments to the regulation with additional amendments.

The Commission on Professional Standards in Public Education adopted the proposed amendments to the regulation language at the public hearing held March 9, 2007. The reason for adopting the regulation is to provide consistency with what is currently being taught and correlate with university coursework for NAC 391.215 and 391.13015.

The beneficial economic effect is that the coursework is updated for individuals seeking this type of endorsement. The immediate effect is that the coursework is updated in correlation with university coursework and what is currently being offered in the schools.

The long-term effect will allow individuals the ability to take the courses and obtain this endorsement.

There is no estimated economic effect on the public, either adversely or beneficially, nor immediate or long term.
