**Section 1.** NAC 488.430 is hereby amended to read as follows:

488.430 ~~[The Inland Navigation Rules Act of 1980, prescribed in Public Law 96-591 and published by the United States Coast Guard as COMDTINST M16672.2D, is hereby incorporated by reference and made applicable to all waters within the boundaries of the State of Nevada.
